SECOND LEASE OF LIFE for a 56 year old who was brought to the hospital, pulseless



After 28 minutes of continuous CPR, pulse and blood pressure was revived

On Sunday afternoon, when Mr. Pathan felt severe discomfort in his chest, he brushed it off thinking it was acidity. Reluctantly, he came to the hospital just because of his family's insistence.

On his way to the hospital he suddenly lost his consciousness. On arriving to Jupiter Hospital's emergency room, Mr. Pathan was almost pulseless. He was non-responsive and the emergency team immediately realised that he had suffered a severe cardiac arrest.

After reviving him, an ECG showed Acute Anterior wall myocardial infarction.

The emergency team ushered him to the cathlab for coronary angiography, which showed critical triple vessel disease. He was taken in for a rescue angioplasty in just about 45 minutes of being brought in.

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“Our trained-for-anything team in ER took matters in hand and managed to revive the HEART. The Cardiology team was prepared well in advance and performed immediate PAMI on him. This was a medically miracle case”

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As per data, for patients who suffer cardiac arrest outside the hospital and receive CPR, the chances of survival are 5 to 10%. And even after that chance of residual damage is high.

Such patients, once reviewed have to be taken for primary angioplasty as early as possible to increase survival chances. Even presence of multivessel disease has high chance of mortality.

“Performing primary coronary angioplasty is always a challenge. Especially when it’s a revived heart and triple vessel disease, to finish the procedure in time it needs extreme level of expertise. Here in Jupiter Hospital we have done it and ultimately happy to save a life and family”


