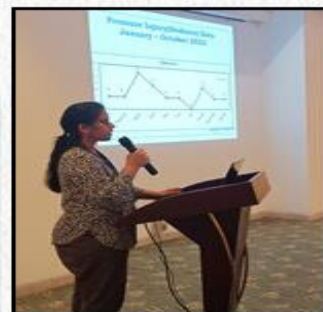

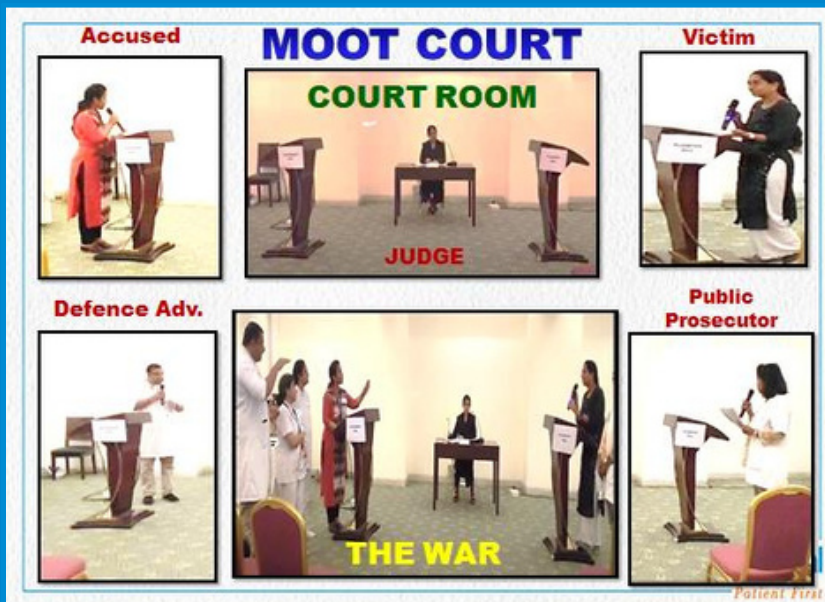

The finale day was concluded with **"Moot Court."**

A moot court simulates a court hearing (usually an appeal against a final decision), in which participants analyze a problem, research the relevant law, prepare written submissions, and present oral argument.

Scenario presented :

A 40 year old female ,case of Obesity, DM and HTN, admitted for Bariatric Surgery.

- Patient was given a package for 5 days stay but LOS increased to 10 days as she developed Pressure injury worsened to stage 3.
- Hence the Victim had approached legal help for the negligence and poor quality care which had affected herself and her patient.

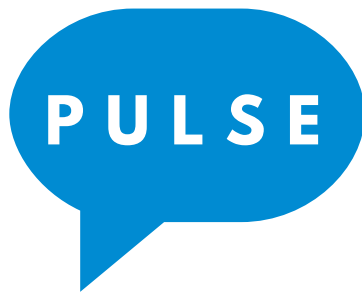

JUDGEMENT GIVEN

- Heard arguments of both the sides and after hearing their case in detail ,this court says that , as an endeavour towards quick justice, settling the matter amicably is a practical and ideal solution rather than dragging the case for several years where both the parties stand to lose even if either of them win.
- In order to draw an end to the dispute, a reasonable amount of settlement is advised, where the hospital takes care of entire treatment and thereafter keep a periodical check on the duty performed by the accused nurse, thus this step would ensure that such incidents are not repeated.
- I would also suggest the patient to be liberal in accepting the fact that the negligence if any was unintentional and therefore it would be not in the interest of theirs if the nurse is punished rather than seeing to it that the patient gets best treatment henceforth.
- The Hospital is expected to adhere to ASSKING Bundle to prevent Pressure Injuries.
- Put up for mediation. On receipt of report of amicable settlement, the case shall be disposed off or may continue if it is not settled.

Strong leadership creates a shared vision that aligns team members and provides a sense of purpose and direction, resulting in improved performance, productivity and innovation.

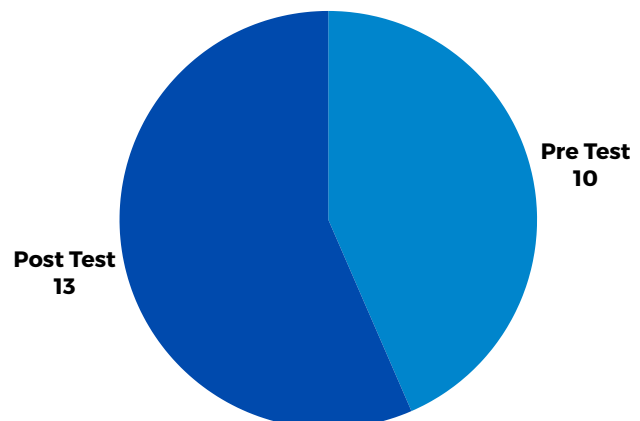
